Batik is a traditional Indonesian clothing which has been recognized by UNESCO as a masterpiece of Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity back in 2009. It is a waxresisting dyeing technique which originated from Java, Indonesia, resulting in different and beautiful designs onto the fabrics of clothing. The word "batik" is actually derived from the word "ambatik", which means "a cloth with little dots". October 2, 2009 was a Friday, marking the day of UNESCO's recognition of Batik. This is why various Indonesians wear Batik on Fridays.

Students and teachers who attended the school during this day showed off their beautiful diversity of designs in Batik along with their pride for this heritage. However, not only do the students celebrate this special day, so did the teachers with their usual uniforms which are laden with Batik designs. The tradition of wearing Batik for this particular day in every academic year has been upheld for years in the BTB showing community, appreciation and recognition for this cultural contribution.

### NATIONAL TEACHERS' DAY - Pluit Putri

Every year on November 25th, Indonesia honours the critical role teachers play in shaping the nation's future generation. The date of this commemoration was chosen due to the Association of Teachers of the Republic of Indonesia – referred to as PGRI – being formed on November 25, 1945. National Teachers' Day has been recognized as an important day to celebrate for many years now, and rightfully so. However, its history still remains unknown to many.

The first organisation for teachers was pioneered by indigenous teachers during the Dutch colonisation era – known as Persatuan Goeroe Hindia Belanda (PGHB). This organisation became the seed that sprouted several other organisations for educators. However, the organisation was banned under Japanese occupation, and all activities ceased – up until Indonesia's liberation. Following the proclamation of August 17th, The Indonesian Teachers' Congress was held in Surakarta on November 25, 1945 which birthed what we now recognize as the Teachers Association of the Republic of Indonesia (PGRI). It was not until 1994 when PGRI's birthday was decreed as a national event, and since then, every year has had a corresponding theme to celebrate the day.

This year, the Ministry of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology (Kemdikbud RI) decided on the theme "Working Together to Celebrate Free Learning". To align with this theme, a logo has been illustrated – which incorporated clever design elements. The icons representing Wi-Fi, laptop, smartphones, and the Zoom logo were included to acknowledge the online period of learning that occurred worldwide, and the integral role teachers played in ensuring a smooth learning experience. The icons depict teachers and students in a joyful pose, indicating the importance of a happy and comfortable dynamic between the two parties to achieve a healthy learning environment.

Although different from National Teachers' Day, BTB students did celebrate International Teachers' Day on October 5th. Several classes expressed their gratitude towards their respective homeroom teachers by gifting them with handwritten cards and more. By celebrating Teachers' Day, Indonesian students will further realise the significant contribution teachers have brought to the nation. They are the mentors who guide us during our youth, and yet their efforts and dedication are frequently overlooked. To our BTB teachers, we wish you a happy National Teachers' Day!

### Kisah Para Pahlawan Tanpa Tanda Jasa

Setiap tahunnya, pasti terdapat seorang guru baru yang mulai mengajar di sekolah kita Bina Tunas Bangsa, dan tentunya akan ada perbedaan di antara guru-guru baru dan guruguru yang sudah lama mengajar di BTB. Sama seperti segala hal lainnya di dunia ini, waktu akan mengubah banyak hal. Jadi, apakah pengalaman guru-guru di sekolah ini juga memengaruhi pandangan mereka terhadap murid-murid serta sekolah kami?

Kesan pertama luar biasa penting. Namun, tidak jarang juga kesan tersebut dapat berubah. Sama halnya dengan Mr. Rikardus (atau Mr. Ricky) yang mengatakan bahwa beliau juga awalnya kurang memahami sifat dan kebiasaan murid-murid, tetapi mulai memahami mereka setelah mengajar selama 1 semester ini.

Selain itu, metode mengajar semua guru pasti berbeda. Ms Fatma memiliki preferensinya sendiri untuk kegiatan belajarmengajarnya. "Untuk metode mengajar, setelah mengetahui kriteria dan tugas yang harus dikumpulkan, saya lebih suka interaktif oral", ujar Ms. Fatma. "Saya tidak suka saya yang lebih banyak bicara, dan muridnya pasif. Saya lebih suka kalau aktif di dua sisi, bahkan lebih suka kalau yang aktif muridnya saja."






# BTB School's New


